# • RADIO WAVES:

Proof of compliance with international standards (ICNIRP) or with European Directive 1999/5/EC (R&TTE) is required of all mobile phone models before they can be put on the market. The protection of the health and safety for the user and any other person is an essential requirement of these standards or this directive. THIS MOBILE PHONE COMPLIES WITH INTERNATIONAL AND EUROPEAN REQUIREMENTS REGARDING EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter/receiver. It was designed and manufactured to comply with the radiofrequency (RF) exposure thresholds recommended by international requirements (ICNIRP)  $^{\circ\circ}$  and by the Council of the European Union (Recommendation 1999/519/EC)  $^{\circ\circ}$ . These limits are part of a set of requirements and establish authorised radiofrequency levels for the public. These limits were established by groups of independent experts on the basis of regular and detailed scientific assessments. They include a significant safety margin intended to ensure the safety of all, regardless of age or state of health.

The exposure standard for mobile phones is determined by a measurement unit known as the Specific Absorption Rate or "SAR". The SAR limit is set by international requirements or by the Council of the European Union at 2 watts/klogram (V/Kg) averaged over ten grams of body tissue. The tests used to determine SAR levels were carried out on the basis of standard usage modes with the phones transmitting at their maximum power level over the entire range of frequency bands. Although the SAR was established at the highest certified level, the actual SAR level for the mobile phone during use is generally much lower than the maximum values. In fact, since mobiles phones are designed to operate at many different power levels, they only use the minimum level of power required to provide a connection to the network. In theory, the closer you are to a base station antenna, the lower the power level required by the mobile phone. The highest tested SAR value for this mobile phone for use at the ear and compliance against the standard is 0.5 W/kg.

The World Health Organisation considers that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for use of mobile phones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using "handsfree" devices to keep mobile phones away from the head and body (fact sheet n° 193). 

# 2 Getting started .....

# 2.1 Set-up

# Inserting and removing the SIM card (1)

You must insert your SIM card in order to use your phone.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted.

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# 2.2 Switching on your telephone

Make a long keypress on the 🕖 key until the telephone comes on, type in your PIN code if necessary and then confirm with the 🥪 key. The main screen is displayed.



If you don't know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code near your telephone and store your card in a safe place when not in use.

If cell broadcast messages are displayed, use the 🞯 key to browse through them in full or press the 🖻 key to return to the main screen.

While the phone is searching for a network, the <<->>> symbol is displayed (???-??? is displayed if your SIM card is rejected by the network, in this case please contact your operator).

In the switch on screen, you also have access to "**Video**" demo function: select the left icon with the navigation key  $\triangleleft$ . Even if no SIM card inside, you will have a quick view of the different options of the video function.

# 2.3 Switching off your telephone

Press the 🕖 key from the main screen (long keypress).

# 3 Calls ......

# 3.1 Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the  $\boxed{100}$  key to place the call. To hang up, press the  $\boxed{100}$  key. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the  $\boxed{100}$  key.

# Making an emergency call

If your phone is covered by the network, dial **112** and press the  $\bigcirc$  key to make an emergency call (or any other number provided by your operator). This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code or unblocking the keypad.

# Making a call with a prefix

- To access the various prefixes, make a long keypress on <a>> for</a>, stop at "+" sign and use the </a> key. • To make an international call, go to +<a></a>, confirm the country, finish dialling the number and send the
- call. • If you already know the prefix you want, go directly to the 🚦 icon and enter the prefix directly followed
- by the number of the person you are calling, • In some companies, telephone numbers all begin with the same digits. By using the "**Prefix**" feature
- Pier, you can save the shared digits, but you will need to enter the variable part. You must create the prefixes yourself.

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#### Automatic redial

If this feature is activated and supported by the network (see page 24), the person you called will be called back automatically until they can be reached.

# 3.2 Calling your voicemail (1)

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine and you can consult it at any time. To access your voicemail, make a long keypress on the 100 key, then send the call using the 100 key.

If the access number for your operator's voicemail service does not appear, dial the number that you were given. To change this number at a later date, refer to "**My Numbers**" (see page 21).

To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

# 3.3 Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the 🔍 key to talk and then hang up using the 🗷 key.

The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact your network operator to check service availability).

#### Muting the ringtone

Press the  $\bigcirc$  key once while the telephone is ringing. Answer the call by pressing the  $\bigcirc$  key, or select "Options".

# Rejecting a call

Press the 🕖 key once or the 🤄 key twice, or select "Options".

# 3.5 Conference calls (1)

Your phone allows you to talk to several people at the same time (up to 5). Once you are on a double call, press , select "**Conference**" then confirm with the key. If a third call comes in, answer it by pressing the key and speak with your new correspondent.

This correspondent becomes a member of the conference if you press  $\textcircled{\mbox{\sc ex}}$ , select "Add conf.", and then confirm by pressing  $\textcircled{\mbox{\sc ex}}$ . Pressing  $\textcircled{\mbox{\sc ex}}$  disconnects the current call.

To end the conference call, press  $\bigcirc$  and select "End conf.".

# 3.6 Double line (ALS) (1)

Your SIM card can contain two distinct telephone numbers. Under "**Call log**", choose "**Double line**" and then select a default line; all your outgoing calls will be made from this number. Incoming calls, however, will continue to use the two lines.



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# **6** Directory .....

# 6.1 Consulting your directory

To access the **directory** from the main screen, press the  $\Rightarrow$  key <sup>(1)</sup> downwards or press the  $\bigcirc$  key and select the  $\bigotimes$  icon from the menu.

#### You have 4 directories:

# SIM directory:

The SIM card's capacity depends on your operator. It is not possible to assign more than one number to a name.

# General directory:

Contains all files created. The SIM card files are not created automatically in the general directory, but they can be copied to it.

# Personal directory:

You can store your personal contacts in this directory (relatives, friends, etc.).

Professional directory:

You can store your professional contacts in this directory (companies, etc.).

In addition to the directories already provided, you can create your own directories (see page 30).

# Searching for a name by its first letter

You can search for the person's name by pressing the key associated with the first letter of his/her name.

For some languages that have a specific entry mode, you should use the "**Search name**" option. Read a contact file

Select a name from your directory, choose the "Options" softkey and select "View".

# Making the call

Press the  $\boxed{\bigcirc}$  key when the name is selected. If several numbers are associated with the name to be called, you must first choose the number from the list (Mobile, Home, Office, etc.) using the  $\Rightarrow$  key. Press the key to make the call.



Information in the directory and the diary may be sent to and received from a computer using the Alcatel One Touch PC suite (see page 87).

# 6.2 Creating a file

Select the directory in which you wish to create a file, press the right softkey, select "**Create contact**" then . You can save the data you have entered at any time by pressing the right softkey and choosing "**Save & quit**". Go to the following field by pressing the key or by using the navigation key  $\clubsuit$ .

When you create a new contact in the product directory, at least one of the following fields must be filled in: 📾 Identity card, 🚆 Birthday, 🕏 Nickname, 🚯 URL Address, 🗐 Numbers, 🚇 Image, 🎯 E-mail, 🐼 Address, 🎒 Notes, 🗊 Perso. Info. 1...4. You can move from one field to another using the 📥 key.

When the field "Birthday" is filled in, an alarm is automatically created in the Diary.

If you use your phone abroad, store the numbers in your directories in international format "+" followed by the country code (see page 16).

# 6.4 Creating a new directory

From the product directory, press the right softkey and select "**Create dir.**", confirm using the key, then name your new directory. You can create up to 13 new directories. You can delete only those directories that you created, by selecting "**Delete dir.**"

# 6.5 Using voice tag

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voice tag allows you to place your call by pronouncing the party's name without using your directory.

Select a file from the product directory and confirm with the right softkey. Then select "Voice tag" and confirm once again. Three different beeps will signal the start of recording, its failure or its success. After recording, you can "Listen to", "Replace" or "Delete" a recorded voice tag command.

The files for which a voice tag command has been recorded are indicated by the it icon. The number of names accessible through voice tag is limited. This feature can be used in all directories except the SIM card directory.

Activate voice tag by a long keypress on the 🔄 key from the main screen, then follow the instructions on the screen.

# 6.6 Assigning a ringtone to a directory

Select a file from the product directory, press the right softkey and select "Dir. ringtone".

When you receive a call from a contact classified in the product directory, the ringtone will be the one assigned to that directory.

# 6.7 Assigning an image, an animation or a video to a file

Select a file from the product directory, press the right softkey and select "Image".

When you receive a call, the picture, animation or video clip that you have chosen will be displayed on the screen. It is possible to assign either an image or a video but not both for the same contact.

# 6.8 Privacy

The data of your directory can be protected (see option "Privacy" page 51).



P Messages .....

From your telephone, you can read, write, send and receive short "Text/SMS" messages and "Multimedia/MMS" and share them with other mobiles ().

Multimedia messages are messages whereby you can send video clips, images, photos, animations, sounds, voice messages (or Vox MMS: simplified MMS that allows you to send a voice memo as a message), appointments (V.CAL) or directory files (V.CARD) to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.

The multimedia MMS function can only be used if the service is proposed by your operator, if your contract includes the MMS option and if all the parameters for sending MMS have been entered (see page 42).

To access the messages from the main screen, press the top of the  $\frac{1}{2}$  key <sup>(2)</sup> or press the  $\bigcirc$  key, select "Messages" with the navigation key and confirm with the  $\textcircled{\mbox{\scriptsize ev}}$  key.

- When **viewing** your messages, you will find the following status icons, depending on: the type of message: I SMS message, A MMS message, A MMS notification, A MMS sending in progress, A MMS message with a sound, II MMS with video clip, A MMS with copyright elements which cannot be forwarded.
- Storage: д messages stored on your SIM card (SMS only), 🖃 messages stored in the phone's memory (MMS notifications).

# 7.1 Receiving and reading messages

# 7.1.1 SMS

When a new SMS arrives, the following message is displayed: "You received a new message!", a beep sounds, the  $\boxdot$  icon shows up, a line with the number of messages appears on the screen. Select this line and press ∞ to read it directly from the main screen. To modify or deactivate the audible signal, see page 44.

# 7.1.2 MMS

You have two ways of managing the reception of MMS: immediate or deferred reception. From "Parameters/MMS Parameters", confirm your choice in the "Mode" option.

- "Immediate": when in idle mode, the 📩 icon will indicate that a new MMS is being downloaded. The message "You received a new message!" appears, a beep sounds, the 🗹 icon shows up, a line with the number of messages appears on the screen. Select this line and press to select and open the MMS.
- "Deferred": you will receive a notification with the name and number of the sender and the title of the message if it has been saved. You can download the MMS at any time in order to read it. You can also delete it without reading it; in this case the sender of the MMS will be informed that it has been rejected (deferred reception may be useful for instance when you are abroad and you do not want to pay a high cost for MMS reception ; you can then read them when you're back in your country).

You can receive video clips, photos, images, or sounds by MMS. These MMS are automatically stored in the memory of your telephone. If you select "Options/Save Items" you can save the video clips, images or sounds or all of them (in this case, save the first item displayed, then select the "Next" option to save the second item, and so on). They are all saved in the multimedia album.

# 7.2.2 Creating MMS

From the main menu, select "Messages/Create message/Multimedia/MMS" and press . By default, you are in edit mode.

Your MMS may contain several pages (maximum memory allocated: usually 50 KB or 100 KB depending on the model and the operator) ; as you create the MMS you will be informed of the memory used (for all pages).

If the acknowledgment of receipt ("**Rpt**") is activated in "**Parameters/MMS Parameters**", you can consult it in the option "**Information**" when selecting a message (see page 35).

You may also attach special files to your MMS such as: a contact from your directory (Vcard), or an appointment from your diary (Vcal). They will be displayed in a separate page (select option "Attachments").

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Reply to an MMS by sending an MMS, an SMS or a Vox MMS message. To send text only, it is advisable to use an SMS.

To send your MMS later on (to add other items or photos for instance) save your MMS ("**Archive** message") as a draft stored in your "**Outbox/Unsent**" folder. Then select it and use the function "Forward" to replace or remove items before sending it.

If the message is not send, the mobile will try to re-send it automatically  $^{(0)}$ . The  $\stackrel{\circ}{\bigtriangleup}$  icon is displayed on the screen and in the "**Outbox/Unsent**" folder, indicating the automatic sending procedure is activated. If it fails completely, you will be notified by a message and the  $\stackrel{\circ}{\Longrightarrow}$  icon in your "**Unsent**" folder indicates that the MMS could not be sent. Select it and press  $\stackrel{\circ}{\boxtimes}$  to send it again, modify it or delete it.

# 7.2.3 Creating Vox MMS (Voice memo)

From the main menu, select "Messages/Create message/Voice/Vox MMS". This function allows you to send a message quickly without having to write. The recipient is not disturbed and simply receives a normal MMS <sup>(a)</sup>. You can reply to any message using a "Voice/Vox MMS".

# 7.3 Speed writing system

The "**Predictive**" mode allows to speed the writing of your SMS or MMS. When you want to write a message, press the "**Options**" softkey, select "**Predictive**" for SMS, or select "**Text options**", then "**Predictive**" for MMS and begin to type ; for instance for "**hello**" type on the following keys (**Composed)**, (**Composed)** 

When in predictive mode, type the first letter:

- if it corresponds to a single word (for instance a), the letter will be displayed, - if it does not exist as a single word (for instance h), the symbol "\*" will be displayed.

The cursor shape varies depending on the input mode selected:  $\blacksquare$  in predictive input mode, 1 in normal mode.

To confirm a word and insert a space, press the  $\clubsuit$  key to the right or press the  $\frac{1}{200}$  key downwards or press the 100 key.

# 7.5 Delete messages

# 8.2 Display

# 8.2.1 Colours

This function enables you to customise the graphic style and the colours of your telephone (menu screens, entry screens etc.)

# 8.2.2 Main screen

The main screen is displayed after your telephone has been switched on and/or when no functions have been used for a short time (calls, sending of short messages...).

You can lock and unlock the keypad by making a long keypress on the 🚳 key.

You can access the main functions directly from the main screen either with the navigation key or selecting the icons displayed on the screen (1)

By selecting the "Main screen/My Images" you can customise it by replacing the default image or animation displayed on your telephone. If you receive an event (incoming call, SMS/MMS, notifications, etc.) the icon, type and quantity of events will be displayed on your main screen allowing you to consult them directly.

# Extra screen

You have the possibility to customise your main screen each time the telephone returns in idle screen by adding a video clip or a slideshow:

Select "Main screen/Extra screen". If you choose a video, when you return to idle mode, the video will be displayed for a few seconds, then the image chosen as main screen will be displayed.

If you choose the slide show, the phone will display the slideshow for a few seconds, then the image chosen as main screen will be displayed.

Note that this extra screen will not be displayed if an event (incoming call, SMS/MMS, voice <u>ک</u> message, wap notification, ...) has not been consulted.

#### 8.2.3 Atmospheres

The "Atmospheres" menu allows you to customise your telephone to suit your own taste. You can modify 7 customisable items at the same time. An Atmosphere comprises:

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() Depending on the operator

4 visual items:

- ON screen image/animation - OFF screen image/animation - Main screen image/animation - Skins and colours 3 sound items: - I melody for incoming calls

- I melody when the telephone is switched on - I melody for notification of incoming messages

When using the mobile phone for the first time, a default Atmosphere is activated.

Even if you choose an Atmosphere, you can still modify the elements in it one by one. You can reactivate an Atmosphere at any time.

When changing an Atmosphere, an installation screen appears until the 7 elements are installed.

The installation of the Atmosphere can be stopped and cancelled if you receive an incoming call or if you press the  $\fbox$  key ; the previous choice of Atmosphere is kept. <u>ک</u>

8.2.4 ON/OFF screens (1)

You can customise your welcome message, animation, melody or image that appears when you switch on your telephone.

You can also customise your OFF screen with an image or animation.

# 8.2.5 Zoom (2)

Two character sizes are available for your telephone screen. Large characters is selected by default. If you wish to display more information select "Zoom".

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# 8.2.6 Menu display

Select a menu display by choosing from the three options proposed:

- "Icons": one icon per screen, with a little part of the previous and next icon. "Image": one icon on all the screen
  "Mosaic": all the menu icons displayed on the screen.

# 8.2.7 Battery saver



You can choose whether to activate this function or not:

- Deactivated: the main screen remains displayed. Activated: a new screen appears after a few seconds displaying the following information: clock, battery charge, signal strength.
- By default, the economy mode is activated.

We advise you to stay in economy mode to maximise your telephone's Øautonomy.

# 8.3 Clock

You can display two clocks (local and remote) at the same time.

Go first to the "Clock type" icon 💁 and select the "2 clocks" option. Then go back to the "Clock set up", select "Local clock", choose a city and confirm. The automatic transition to daylight saving time is activated. Repeat the same operation for the "Remote clock".

#### **Display format**

You can display your clock in analogue or digital format and the date in the following formats: day/month/year, month/date/year or year/month/day in digits or using the first three letters for the day and month.

# 8.4 Set my shortcuts

You can customize your menu by selecting the function, or telephone number, or URL, in the order you want. You will find your new customized menu under the item "My Shortcuts" from the main screen.

# 8.5 Customising the keys (1)

8.5.1 Operator/Personal key and softkeys ()

These keys have predefined functions, which vary from one model to another (operator services, games access, or Games & Applications, ...). You can customise (1) them for long and short keypresses, giving them the functions that you wish. For example, they can be used as a shortcut to access the Diary, to write a message,...

# 8.5.2 Keypad

By customising your keys, you can call someone or access a function directly from the main screen pressing on one key. Choose the first key you wish to programme, then select one of following options :

- "Numbers" if you wish to programme a direct call, "Function" if you wish to assign a specific function to the selected key, • "URL" if you wish to programme an Internet address.

Repeat this operation key by key.

# 8.6.1 Keypad lock

Activate/deactivate the automatic keypad lock.



If the telephone is plugged in using a car kit accessory or the charger, it will be unlocked automatically.

Display language for messages (select using  $\diamondsuit$ ). The "Automatic" option selects the language according to the subscription network (if available).

# 8.6.3 Dictionary

You have a dictionary to which you can add your own words in addition to those suggested by the predictive input system. When you consult your dictionary, you can add, modify or erase words by using "**Options**".

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#### Creating an appointment and programming an alarm

When you create an appointment ("**Create**" option), you can also activate an alarm. You can set the desired alarm activation time to coincide with your appointment time.

# Creating a task

Scroll to the B icon using the  $\blacklozenge$  key, and confirm using the O key. Select **"Select type**", then confirm once again using the O key and enter the type of task to be performed ("to do" or call appointment), then enter the purpose.

This list can be arranged by deadline or by priority. To do this, scroll to the  $\Re$  icon using the  $\clubsuit$  key, then confirm using the key.

You can set an alarm for a task for which you have set a due date. This alarm will sound on the chosen day at the time that you entered.

#### 9.2 Alarms

#### Alarm clock

First set the alarm frequency (daily or only once), then enter the time and date and confirm by pressing the 🐼 key. You can also enter the purpose of the alarm and then confirm with the 🔅 key.

#### Timer

Set the amount of time desired before the alarm is to sound and confirm with the 👄 key.

# Options

When the alarm has been activated, the  $rac{100}{100}$  icon is displayed on the main screen. The alarm will sound whether the handset is switched on or off and can be shut off by pressing the c key.

If you have chosen the "Snooze" option, the alarm will sound at regular 10 minute intervals.

# 9.3 Converter

The currency converter allows you to:

- · Convert a currency directly into euros and vice versa
- · Convert a sum of money into another currency (e.g. dollars to pounds).

For a conversion into euros, you can modify the default currency by selecting "Set up".

<sup>(1)</sup> For the former european national currencies, the currency converter uses the final Euro conversion rates set on 31/12/1998, which are used in accordance with official conversion rules.



If converting between international currencies, both currencies must be selected. You must also enter the appropriate exchange rate.

An exchange rate value is pre-set for each currency. You can change this value by selecting "Set up".



From the main screen, enter the amount in euros to be converted into the programmed currency, then press the  $\bigcirc$  key and select "Converter".

#### 9.4 Calculator



Enter a number and confirm with the  $\bigcirc$  key, then select the type of operation to be performed using the  $\stackrel{\bullet}{=}$  key and confirm again.

Enter the second number and press (

Select the "=" sign to display the result.

To return to the main screen, press the 🔁 key (long keypress).

# 9.5 Memory

View available memory space.

Your telephone's memory is shared between several functions: directory, diary, messages, voice messages, voice tag, images and melodies, games and applications, video clips. For example, if you use a lot of memory for your voice memos, you will have less memory available for the directory.



Do not forget to delete large items such as voice memos, MMS, images, photos, recorded sounds, applications, video clips..., in order to free up memory space. You can also delete certain items included in your telephone when you bought it.

# 9.6 Voice memo

The voice memo feature acts as a Dictaphone and enables you to record personal messages. To record a voice memo, select "**Voice memo**", then "**Save**", and begin speaking after the beep. Once the voice memo has been created, you can access the following options:

# 9.7 Infrared (IrDA)

Your phone's infrared feature allows you to exchange contacts, diary data, images, videos, melodies via an infrared link with an other mobile or a PC. The infrared port is located on the top of your telephone.

#### Sending data

To send data, select the directory file, then select the "**Data transfer**" option. It is not necessary to activate the infrared feature before sending.

# **Receiving data**

To receive data, you must activate the infrared feature. A message will advise you of the arrival of data; you then save the data by pressing the 🐵 key or reject it using the 🦻 key.

Once you have selected the option, the  $\Xi$  icon appears on your screen. Infrared will be deactivated automatically after a short while  $^{\circ\circ}$ . The connection will cut off if you have an incoming call. You can receive up to three calling cards (V.Card) or appointments (V.Cal) at the same time.


# 9.8 Alarms list

You can view all the alarms that you have set. The  ${\mathfrak V}$  icon will appear on your main screen if the alarm clock or the timer have been set, or if the alarm is set for the current day or the following day.

# 9.9.1 Compose

Select "Compose" then use the keypad as shown below:

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#### 9.9.2 Record

Select "Record" to record a sound of your own. If you want to listen it, select it and press the "Options" softkey.

# 9.10 Voice tag

Voice tags allow you to access one of the menu functions by pronouncing the name of that function.

Recording a voice tag

In order to record a voice tag for one of the menu functions, select "Voice tag" and the desired function and then follow the instructions.

The functions for which a voice tag has been recorded are indicated by the  $\mathfrak{A}$  icon. There are 10 functions accessible through voice tag.

# Using a voice tag

You activate "**voice tag**" by a long keypress on the **C** key from the main screen. To use a voice tag, follow the instructions on the screen.

After recording, you can "Listen to", "Replace" or "Delete" a recorded voice tag command.

This feature gives you a quick description of your phone's main functions and provides handy hints to optimize the way you will use it.

From the main screen, press the  $\bigcirc$  key to access the menu then select the  $\mathbf{T}$  icon ; you access the tips and tricks menu.

You can also find this feature inside of each main function (select "Options").

Scroll the text. Aside the explanations, a small animation is displayed to show you how to use the function.

After reading the current explanations, you can either go back to the tips & tricks home page, or select "**Options**" in order to connect to the WAP options (see page 66).

# II.I Access WAP menu (I)

WAP (Wireless Application Protocol) is a service that allows you to access the mobile Internet, where you can obtain information such as weather conditions, stock market information, traffic information, etc.

- "Homepage" launches the WAP browser on the homepage of the default profile.
- "Bookmarks" gives access the list of your favourite sites or add new sites to them.
- "Profiles" lists the Wap profiles.
- "Enter address" allows you to directly access the WAP page for which you enter the URL address.

If you select the GPRS/GSM transmission mode, select a GPRS bearer and then a GSM bearer; fill in the required parameters for each one  $^{(0)}$ .

# **11.3** Direct access/profile access

From the main screen, select "My Settings/More settings/WAP access", to change the launch access:

- Direct access: when you launch WAP from the main menu, you go directly to the homepage of your default Wap profile
- Profile access: when you launch WAP from the main menu, you will have the following items: Homepage, Bookmarks, Profiles, Enter address.

#### II.4 GPRS function ()

Your mobile phone has an efficient high-speed modem based on GPRS technology  $^{\scriptscriptstyle (I)}$ . With this modem you will be able to surf faster on the WAP and send your MMS more quickly. This service may be billed at a different rate (contact your operator for more information).

- You can use the **GPRS** function if: the service is supplied by your operator,
- your subscription includes the GPRS option,
- the profiles have been configured and the corresponding bearer selected is GPRS or GPRS/GSM (see page 64); the g icon appears when the GPRS context is active.

# 11.5 WAP browser options

Once you have launched the Wap browser, while reading a page, you can access to the options by selecting the  $\bigotimes$  icon on the top left of the screen, or press the right softkey "**Options**", or press  $\mathscr{B}$  (long keypress).

# 12.1 Album menu

To access the Album from the main screen, press the navigation key to the left or to the right  $\triangleleft$ . The Album is a function that groups together all visual and sound items in your telephone, regardless of whether they are embedded, downloaded, recorded or composed.

# This function comprises 3 menus:

- the images album, containing images, icons, photos etc...
- the sounds album, containing sounds and melodies.
- the video album, containing videos.

In each of these 3 menus, you have the possibility to create new folders with the option "Create folder".

# 12.2 My Images

You can select an image or a photo and use it as the main screen or the ON/OFF screen. You may change it, send it by MMS or assign it to a contact in the directory using the "**Image**" option (see page 29).

The Images album is made up of the following folders ():

- General: list of all images (built-in or created) from all album folders.
- Photos: default folder for pictures taken with the camera.
- Images: contains all images not belonging in one of the other folders.
- Icons: contains EMS, stamps...
- **Frames**: contains frames for enhancing your images.

For easier searching, the images/photos are displayed on the screen in reduced size. To view one image at a time, select an image, press 💿 and click on "**View**".

Then, from this view you can scroll through the images by making a short keypress on  $\diamondsuit$ . A long keypress will start the slide show (or press then "**Slideshow**").

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# 12.3 My Sounds

Choose a sound for the ON/OFF screen, for an incoming call, a message alert or an alarm (see page 44).

- Crazy sounds,
- **Recorded** sounds (only contains recordings made with the "**Record**" function and the "**Memo** ->**Album**" function),
- **Composed** sounds (only contains compositions made using "**Compose**").

# 12.4 My Videos

- The "My Videos" Album is made up of the following folders ():
- General, contains all the items from all the folders (created and embedded)
- Recorded, contains the video clips you have recorded
- Grazy clips,
- Video trailers.
- You can search any Image, Sound or Video files by pressing the key bearing the first character of the filename.

Your telephone is fitted with a camera allowing you to take photos, short animations, and video clips (about 10 seconds) that you can use in different waysstore them in your "Media Album",

- send them in a multimedia message (MMS) to a mobile phone or an e-mail address (see page 38), customise your main screen (see page 45),
- assign them to a contact in your directory (see page 31),
  transfer them by IRDA to your computer using Alcatel One Touch PC Suite,
- modify your photos adding frames, stamps, etc (see page 77).

#### **13.1** Photo applications

To access this function from the main screen, press the right softkey, then using the navigation key select "Take a picture". You then go straight to the photo shot screen.

#### 13.1.1 Taking a picture

Your phone must be switched on to take a photo. The screen acts as viewfinder. Position the object or landscape in the viewfinder and press 💿 to take the picture. The lens is situated on the back of the phone. Please do not touch it. To the left of the lens there is a mirror to make sure you are well placed in order to take a photo of yourself.

#### Taking a picture with sound

You can record a background sound, while you are taking a picture. To do so, keep your finger pressed down on the 🐵 key when taking the photo. A screen will ask you to record your sound. If you release your finger, the recording will stop. Press 🔁 to return to the photo shot screen.



Select "Image size" in the list of options or press the *<sup>207</sup>* key until you reach the size you require: VGA (640x480), and Panoramic (512x288) optimised to be sent to a PC, XL (128x160), L (128x128) for local use or MMS, M (64x64) to assign it to a directory file for instance, S (32x32) to create your very own stamps (see page 77).

### Capture mode

Select "Capture mode" in the options list or keep pressing the  $\overline{\mathbb{Q}}$  key to choose from one of the following modes:

- **Single**: a single photo; this is the default mode.
- Animation x 4: in this mode, you can take 4 consecutive photos like a small slide show. The number at the top right of the screen shows you which photo your are on: 1/4, 2/4, ....4/4. When you have taken the 4th photo, the animation will start automatically.
- **Mosaic**: in this mode, you will get an image made up of 4 thumbnails. To do this, proceed as for the animation, once the "**Mosaic**" has been selected (see above).

#### Frame

Choose a frame from the list offered and press  $\textcircled{\baselineskip}$ . The frame will be placed in your photo shot screen; if the image is to your liking, press  $\textcircled{\baselineskip}$  to take the photo. You will also find this option in the "**Modify**" function (see page 77).



#### Quality

Select "Quality" in the list of options or access it directly by pressing the  $10^{\circ}$ ,  $20^{\circ}$ ,  $10^{\circ}$  keys:

high : High quality: excellent quality to be sent to a PC, std: Standard quality: compromise between size and quality,

eco: Economy quality: memory space is optimized.



#### 13.2.4 Direct access to the video function, photo capture, or album from MMS composition
